- Connection: Understanding and listening to one another.
- Use correct names in Skyward and avoid nicknames.
- People will find a way to belong based on options (good/bad)
- Everyone's value is seen without any attachments or expectations
- Belonging matters because it didn't for too long and we all miss out when everyone's voices aren't heard
- Truthfulness
- People don't engage if they don't feel like they belong
- Do not pay lip service to the concept of belonging; it requires deep understanding of each individual
- Belonging can change someone's attitude about school. If you feel like you belong, you will do more
- Belonging matters because it helps a person feel acknowledged and feel like they are part of something

- Belonging between pillars of community: ASB, sports-matters
- Belonging never ends
- That we can't overlook the importance of belonging for parents and families within our schools
- We need to understand the barriers that students face
- Belonging matters because the place you belong (the people in that place) will get you through hard times, which fosters resilience
